## REV PETER WATERHOUSE'S 25TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS

## QUEENS AWARD FOR ENTERPRISE 2008 WINNER MR MICHAEL LEITHROW OF CADGER BANK, LANCHESTER

Michael, previously employed as Financial

Accounting Manager by Black and Decker at Spennymoor and Regional Manager (Administration Services) by Wimpey Homes and Construction both in the North East and Home Counties has supported the community for many years. Michael, a resident of Cadger Bank,

Lanchester, was instrumental in setting up the Northern Pinetree Trust as a social enterprise and registered charity, dedicated to helping the most seriously disadvantaged in the North East.

Formerly a Trustee and since 2002 its General Manager, Michael has helped develop the Pinetree Trust into a leading specialist enterprise agency working predominantly with people with a disability who wish to consider working for themselves. Michael also acts as General Manager to the Spirit of Enterprise Loan fund which makes over 30 loans per annum and has lent in excess of £500,000 to emerging North East businesses.

Northern Pinetree Trust helps over 100 people a year with a disability or from disadvantaged communities to establish businesses of their own and many more to explore the possibility of doing so. Specialist programmes are available working with offenders, ex-offenders and the long-term sick. More recently the organisation has

started to develop new programmes working with those 50+ and veteran service men and women to assist them to consider starting up businesses.

## OUT OF SIGHT?

Thomas Gray, a local student, has graduated with a first class honours degree in Fine Art from Newcastle University. Thomas's achievement assumes even higher recognition when it is learned that he is in fact, partially sighted. He has never let this hamper him, however, and has used his unique perspective on everyday life to great effect in his creative art. His achievements and activities have been well documented by The Village Voice, including his ranking amongst AQA Exam Board's top five A-level Art and Design marks in the summer of 2004, when he gained 100%, and his exhibition of *Out of Sight* at Lanchester All Saints Catholic Church in the summer of 2006. The village itself has often been an important point of reference in Thomas's work, as he

has sought to explore the place in which he grew up and from where he gained his independence.

In 2006, he created *Out of Sight*, a six-minute video piece which retraced a familiar childhood journey through Lanchester, from home to school. Thomas explains "I began by collating video and photographic documentation of the route and it became apparent that my memory of the journey was influencing my documentation of it, attracting me to specific landmarks and pieces of imagery that I had become so familiar with throughout my childhood. Many of these places had attained such high levels of significance through their being specifically chosen for me as places of refuge or safety. I utilised this

familiar imagery, take place for the viewer, at the Hatton Gallery extracted it from its original context and experience." He intends to further develop his skills base in film and video by undertaking a Masters degree in Digital Media through video and his degree show, entitled 'Pauses' ran from the 30th May to 17th June at Newcastle University in September of this year.

## WADE'S BOOK REPRINTED

Author Fred J Wade lived in Annfield Plain and played a leading role in a popular walking group. He was an authority on the history of the area and wrote fascinating books about the Derwent valley as well as South Moor, Stanley, Tanfield, Annfield Plain and the Lanchester area. His book about Lanchester and Slatley, originally published in 1970, is to be reprinted and will be available for sale at Lanchester library, price £7, with all of the profits going to charity.

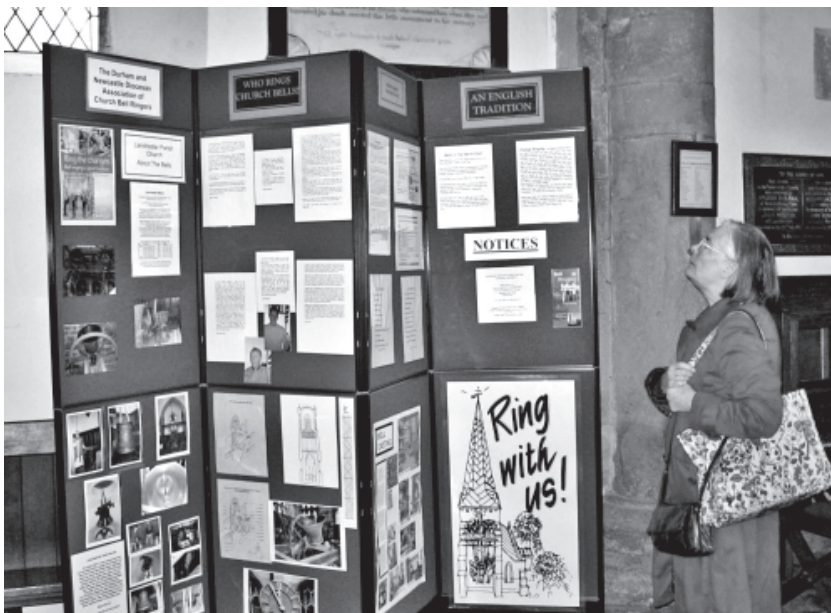

# LANCHESTER PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

## HELD ON 17th JUNE 2008

As there was no-one able to give a Police Report, the next item on the Agenda was the confirmation and approval of the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting and Ordinary

Meeting which was held on the 20th of May 2008. **Matters Arising.** The Annual Report for 2007/08 was discussed. It was agreed that a List of Councillors would be included and that the

telephone numbers of Councillors would be given, together with their address or c/o Park House, whichever the Councillor chose. It is to be delivered to everyone in the Ward by a delivery company at a cost of £150.

**Village Handyman.** Mr David Maddox has been appointed as handyman and started work on the 16th of June. The Parish Clerk showed Councillors all the paperwork involved in his employment and she suggested that training in the use of certain implements, etc. be given as necessary for Health and Safety requirements and Cllr Mrs Cook stated that training courses were available at County Hall and also through British Conservation Trust Volunteers.

**Nominations for County Durham Association of Local Councils.** Two Councillors would apply for the post of executives.

**Primary Strategy for Change.** The Clerk gave Members the latest information; the nearest primary schools to be affected were Hamsteels and Esh Winning. **Minutes of Meetings** held by the Recreation, Planning and Finance, Development & General Purpose Committees were approved.

**Kitswell Road Recreation Area.** Mr Simon Green attended the meeting and gave Members the plans for the proposed development. These showed two separate areas for play and a cycle track at an estimated cost of £80,000 for which a grant for half the amount had been applied for.

About a dozen children had helped to complete the forms and had been involved in the design of the cycle track, having visited three local tracks with Mr Green, Mrs Gladstone and Cllr Burton. It was agreed that a consultation evening be held to ask the opinion of local residents, the meeting to take place at the cricket club. Tuesday 1st July at 6.30 pm was provisionally arranged, with information to be delivered to local residents beforehand. Members thanked Mr Green and Mike Gladstone for their work involving the young people and for coming up with this scheme; Mr Gladstone replied that the young people had thanked the Council at their meeting.

**Correspondence.** A letter had been received from the Department for Communities and Local

Government asking whether the Council wished to have Parish Council elections in two years time. It was decided that it would be too expensive to run this election on its own and the next elections should take place at the same time as the next Local Elections, even though this would mean that Members would be serving the Council for a longer period.

**Appointment of independent member to Durham Police Authority.** This would involve some 10 to 12 hours paid attendance per week. Members were asked if they were interested although applications are open to anyone, not just Councillors.

**Summer Activities** A request from Leisureworks to use the Park House recreation area for summer activities was considered. This is to be run by Play Rangers and daily sessions would be tailored to the needs of the children who would attend. The scheme is to be Lottery Funded. It was agreed that permission be granted as long as any damage that was incurred would be made good. Details are available from the Leisureworks magazines and their new website.

**CiLCA Course** It was agreed that the Clerk attend these training sessions and that the Council pay the fee.

**Developing Mental Health services for aged in Co Durham and Darlington**

A consultation document was shown and Cllr Burton agreed to peruse this and comment at the next meeting.

**The Financial Report** was given by the Clerk and the accounts were presented for both approval and payment. **Newsletters.** As part of becoming a Quality Parish Council, a quarterly Newsletter is proposed to be produced. The Clerk had created a very interesting display

showing various types of size and font, colour or black and white, print or photocopy (comparative prices) and distribution. Suggested publication dates are August, November, February and May. The newsletter also needs a name.

**Statue on Valley Walk** Groundwork have suggested that the 6-

foot statue of a Roman soldier be donated by them for siting on the Valley Walk. It was agreed that before a decision is made, the Clerk should enquire about Third Party Insurance and maintenance.

**Date of Next Meeting** Tuesday 15th July at 7.15pm in the Conference Room at Park House, Lanchester.

## PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING

A Meeting was held by the Planning Committee after the Ordinary Meeting to consider the following two applications:

1. The erection of one agricultural building at the Stobbilee Farm, Lanchester.

NO OBJECTIONS.

2. Felling of a monkey puzzle tree to the ground at No2, Colepike Hall,

Lanchester. It was agreed that some independent advice with regard to the health and vitality of the tree would be taken from the County Arboricultural Dept before a decision is made.

## 'THE MASTER' COMES TO LANCHESTER

Red Cross workers in the area come together twice a year to compare notes and socialise, and on Saturday 7th June the meeting was held in Lanchester Community Centre. After lunch provided by Crinnions and a little networking, they listened to a talk by Martin Hewitson on the work of the Red Cross at the scene of major disasters. A major piece of kit which has been

on call in the North East for only eight weeks is the Renault Master, a medium-sized van which contains the Command and Control System. A lap-top computer can control any number of independent units working on the site and communicate with them all to ensure maximum efficiency. This vehicle, one of the first in the country to move into action, was available for inspection

by the delegates, who could also see displays by each local group. Lanchester's display proudly announced that we have over 40 volunteers, all unpaid, who mainly staff the Red Cross Shop. This recently held the title of top shop in the area.

Two members provide Red Cross services at the Lions' carnival and bonfire and Operatic Society events.

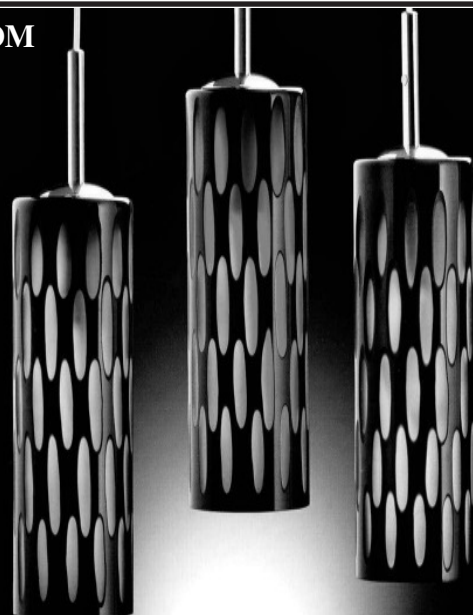

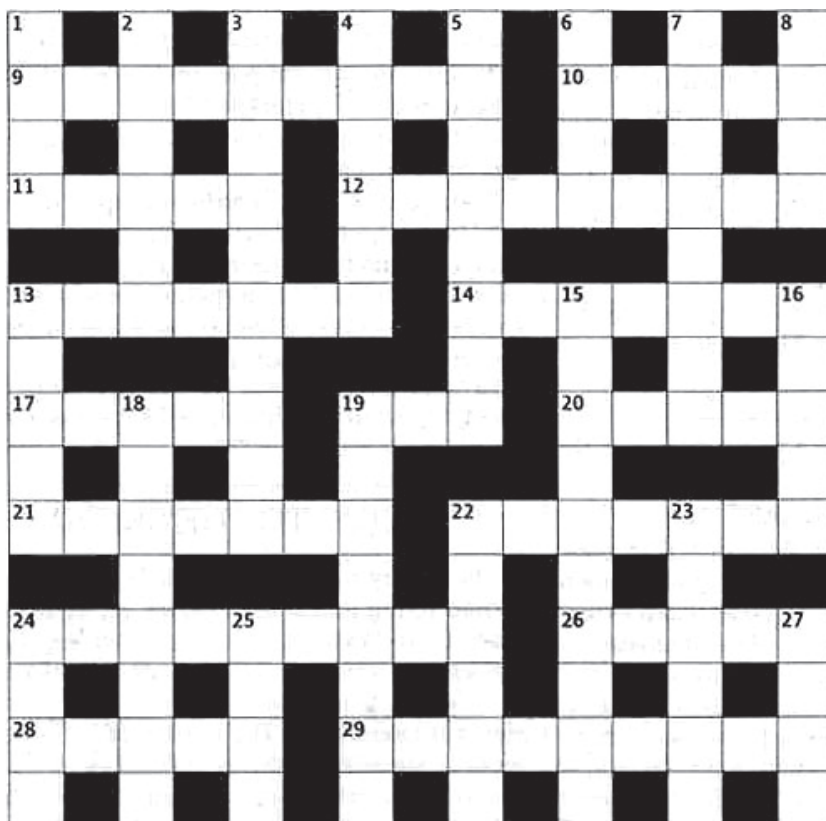

## NORTHUMBRIAN NIGHT

Live performances of music are usually anticipated with high hopes if not a frisson of excitement. At a recent Community Centre Northumbrian Night the performances certainly did not disappoint the audience. The evening's entertainment was organised by Dr Ian Brunt, President of the Community Centre and musician extraordinary, in order to raise funds for the Centre. He gathered together for the occasion an ensemble of highly talented long-standing friends in Rosie Midgley (mezzo-soprano), Glenis Malkin (violin/cello), Andrew Davison (Northumberland Pipes), Brian Stewart and Calum Stewart (flutes) and David Malkin (classical guitar). Ian himself played

the harpsichord, flute and Northumberland Pipes during the course of the evening. The programme of traditional music, composed mainly in the 18th century, had a strong Scottish slant reflecting the turbulent history of the region. It is to be remembered that the Northumberland - Scottish border was in a state of flux for centuries, Berwick for example, being finally attached to Northumberland only in 1885. Renditions of tunes such as Jimmy Allen, Whittingham Fair, Sleep Well My Darling, Swindon, The Flowers of the Forest, Blow the Wind Southerly and many more were much appreciated by those present. They not only had the opportunity to

hear this music played on traditional instruments but also to see such rare tools of the trade at close hand. ## LANCHESTER COUPLE AIM TO CROSS EUROPE NORTH TO SOUTH ON A TANDEM

A Lanchester couple are aiming to be the first people to ride the Eurovelo route 7: The Sun Route, all the way from Norway's North Cape to Malta, on a tandem.

Neil and Kathryn Gander, from Hollinside, are more likely to be seen on mountain bikes but fell in love with the idea of the long distance cycle route which will take them through nine countries in five months. Although they're doing the trip for the challenge, they've also decided to use it as a means of raising money for two charities:

The Huntington's Disease Association and SOS-Children's Villages. The journey begins on July 24th when they leave North Shields by ferry for Bergen in Norway. From there it's a five day voyage north by sea to Nordkapp, over 500km inside the Arctic Circle and as far north as it is possible to get by road in Europe. Then it's simply a matter of heading south - through Norway, Finland, Sweden, Denmark, Germany, the Czech Republic, Austria and Italy to arrive in Malta sometime around the end of 2008.
