## IT'S ALL ABOUT PEOPLE

### SEASONAL FLU

To protect people who are most at-risk of serious illness if they develop flu, the Department of Health recommends flu vaccination every year. Your local GP practice is carrying out a free seasonal flu programme, for their own patients, who are aged 65 or over, or suffer from chronic disease, diabetes or chest problems. Pregnant women and carers can also be vaccinated and are advised to have the vaccination. Please remember to inform

the person giving the vaccination if you have an egg allergy, had a previous adverse reaction to a flu vaccination or if you are feeling unwell.

Lanchester Medical Centre will have the flu vaccine available from Monday 21st September 2015 and will run through to early 2016, however it is advisable to have your vaccination as soon as possible. Contact your local GP practice for further details.

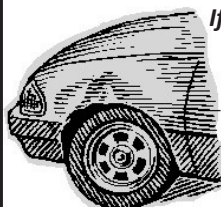

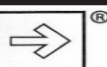

## HOW HORSES ARE HELPING PEOPLE AT MAIDEN LAW

Anyone who has travelled from Maiden Law crossroads towards Burnhope recently will have noticed that just after Chapman's Well Fishing Pond, there are horses, ponies and donkeys happily wandering around the six acres of meadows and tracks that back on to Burnhope ponds and nature reserve.

These very special horses spend some of their time helping people suffering from depression, young people with learning and behavioural difficulties, troubled families, those suffering from eating

disorders, bereavement, trauma, relationship issues and much more. So how on earth do they do it? First of all they are never ridden. They are a family herd who love to meet people who visit, but most of all being non verbal creatures they are fantastic at assessing the emotions, energy, intention and state of mind, not only of other horses but of people too! Secondly, they work with a human team of mental health professionals and equine specialists, skilled in helping people begin to understand how they can take ownership of their problems and

through interactions with the horses, can begin to turn their lives around.

We are always keen to meet up with the local community and to invite people to come to visit us and perhaps become one of our team of volunteers and supporters. After all, the most boring jobs around the centre become much more fun when done in the company of a couple of donkeys or even of Finlay and Brego, our two yearling ponies! ## A MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE ...

Summer recess sees a suspension of activity in Westminster, although the huge operation of ministerial correspondence, enquiries and research continues behind the scenes right through summer, whether the house sits or not. In the short term, Labour awaits the results of the leadership contest, which appears more and more interesting by the day. When you read this, the announcement of the winner will be imminent. I backed Andy Burnham and have worked within his inner campaign team,

but whoever wins I will support them moving forward. As the main opposition party, we must be effective in holding the government to account. As parliament is currently in recess, my article this month focuses on a local matter of concern for Lanchester. I am sure you are aware by now that unfortunately the longstanding branch of Barclays Bank will close in October. I have received the following information from Barclays which you may find

interesting, as follows:

- Barclays have a reciprocal arrangement with Lanchester Post Office. Via their central and easily accessible location, all customers can pay in cash and cheques and can also withdraw cash from the Post Office branch.
- Until the Barclays branch closes, Barclays will be speaking with all their customers that use the branch to make sure they are clear about how they can do their banking following their exit.

- The staff at the bank will also be running some 'tea and teach' sessions for any customers that would like to learn more about online banking and getting online in general. These will be run by the bank's 'digital eagles' who are all trained in online accessibility.
- Barclays will also be approaching all their business customers to make sure they know how to access the services following their departure from the village.

Efforts are being made to ensure there will be no loss of a cash point in the village. However, it will be moved from its current location and will no longer be serviced by Barclays as their entire services are leaving the village. Arrangements are still being made, but I am aware of the high volume of usage from local residents and am happy to assist if required to ensure that a cash point remains in Lanchester in the future.

## POLICE REPORT

At the PACT meeting held on Tuesday 4th August the community decided to introduce Antisocial Behaviour as the PACT priority for the forthcoming month. This was decided due to the increased number of youths congregating in the village from 4 pm onwards most evenings. Since the start of the six weeks' summer holidays, Police have increased patrols in the village to deter nuisance behaviour and as a result the volume of youths has begun to decrease. We've also had approximately 20 warning letters sent home to youths regarding their behaviour and confiscated numerous footballs from youths outside business premises following

complaints that youths were intentionally aiming the balls at shop windows. These patrols will continue for the foreseeable future. Over the previous month we targeted community concerns of speeding on Durham Road. During a four week period we distributed 30 warning letters to drivers, 8 drivers were given verbal warnings and 2 drivers were issued with Traffic Offence Reports, which could result in the driver attending a Speed Awareness Course or receiving a fine and points on their licence. Starting on Wednesday 2nd September between 1-2 pm we will begin hosting alternate weekly Police Drop-in Sessions at Lanchester Garden Centre. During the sessions local officers

will be available to speak to members of the public regarding any problems or concerns as well as providing crime prevention material. Everyone is welcome so please come along. This month Durham County Council's Neighbourhood Services Unit successfully appeared in court and obtained two Community Protection Orders against two regular scrap metal collectors. These orders will remain in place for the next two years and will prevent both men collecting scrap in County Durham. The next PACT meeting is due to take place on Tuesday 1st September at 6.30 pm outside Burnhope Primary School.

Our speaker, Jenny Cathcart took us through '4,000 Years of Information Technology' and what an interesting, informative journey it was! The earliest civilizations recognised

the need for collecting and storing information. The abacus was in use by 2,500 BC, water driven clocks appeared in ancient China, distance travelled could be measured by odometers, and the astrolabe enabled astronomical measurements, improving navigation.

The Antikythera device, constructed perhaps as early as 205 BC, was an ingenious mechanism, a very early computer, which used meshing bronze gears. The first cash register was invented in the 1880s and the typewriter appeared in 1860. The Enigma Machine may have helped to end the war early when it deciphered German codes. In the post war world, technology has made huge strides, especially in the production of smaller devices for the individual. Advances in health technology are very exciting, bringing benefits to so many people.

Marie Murphy gave the vote of thanks for such a fascinating presentation and the evening was rounded off by coffee, biscuits and chat.

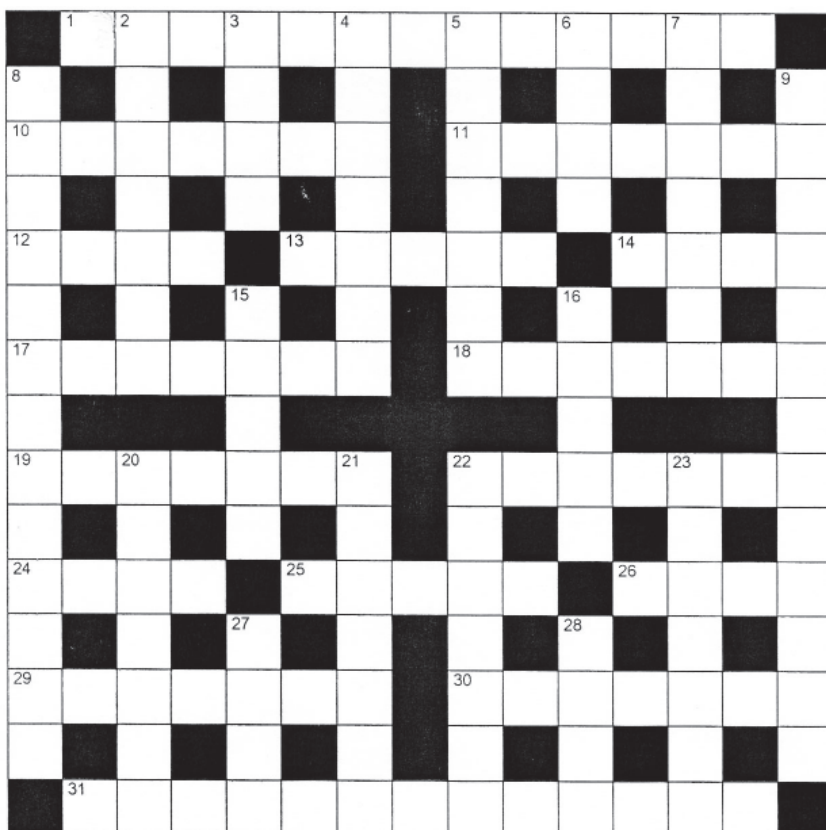

# EPIC CYCLE RIDE FOR LANCHESTER GIRL

As the Tour De France came to an end, one teenage cycling fanatic from Lanchester was enduring a mammoth 500-mile charity ride of her own. Grace Stewart-Piercy, 14, cycled from Edinburgh to London in just six days, raising nearly £3,000 for homeless charity Shelter.

Grace, who completed a 150-mile coast to coast ride when she was just nine, was joined by her father, Simon Stewart-Piercy, who cycled more than 100 miles with a fractured arm after falling off his bike on Friday morning.

An emotional Grace arrived to a noisy welcome party at

Shelter headquarters, Old Street, London at the end of the ride. She said: "I'm tired, but happy. It's been really hard but great in the end, great to get finished." Grace added: "We've done bike rides each year but we just push ourselves harder. We chose Shelter because there are so many homeless people and it is a worthy cause."

The pair thanked their supporters throughout the country. "When people realised what we were doing then we got a lot of support, the send off in Edinburgh was brilliant and the welcome here is great too," said Grace's father, Simon. Campbell Robb, chief

executive of Shelter, said the achievement was "absolutely amazing". He added: "She is very emotional, she has come a long way. It is this kind of action and enthusiasm that sends a message to people that are homeless, or are worried about losing their home, that there are people out there doing this great thing for them."

## RECIPE OF THE MONTH

### Beef Stifado

September is the month when everyone returns to work and school after the summer holiday. Many have enjoyed time in Greece, with memories of its beautiful scenery, culture and food. Beef stifado is the Greek version of the stew prepared all over the Mediterranean, with its distinctive taste coming from the herbs used in its preparation. I've made this stew many times, it's simple to make and it's really good!

After the first 2 steps, it can be transferred to a slow cooker and really benefits from this mode of cooking.

Serves 4

1 tablespoon of olive oil  
2lb stewing beef  
8 oz onions, chopped  
2 garlic cloves, crushed  
8 oz can tomatoes  
2 tablespoons tomato puree  
Juice of 1 lemon  
1 tablespoon freeze-dried oregano  
Pinch of freeze-dried thyme  
1 teaspoon sugar  
Seasoning  
Tarragon sprigs to garnish - optional

#### METHOD

1) Preheat the oven to 150C/300F/Gas 2. Heat the oil in a flameproof casserole into which the beef can fit comfortably. Cut the meat into 1 inch cubes and fry until lightly

browned. Add the onions and garlic and fry until golden brown.

2) Add the tomatoes, tomato purée, lemon juice, oregano, thyme and sugar with a little seasoning (you can adjust the seasoning after cooking) and enough water to come halfway up the beef.

3) Turn thoroughly to mix all the ingredients, cover the casserole dish and cook in the oven for about 3 hours. Stir at least once during the cooking time. The sauce will reduce to an almost jam-like consistency and the beef will be completely tender. Serve with rice or mashed potatoes and seasonal vegetables.

## Table Tennis Club Update

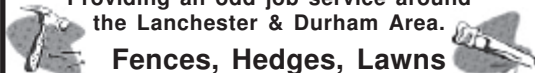

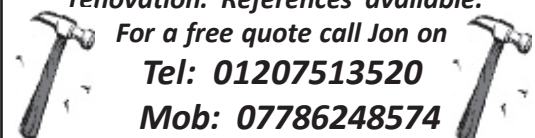
