### NEW VICAR FOR LANCHESTER

Rev Stephanie Clark, vicar of St Andrew's Church in Stanley, has been appointed as Area Dean of Lanchester. She will continue in her present position as vicar of Stanley and South Moor.

Hernewrole will cover a wide area across Derwentside, but she will sometimes conduct services at All Saints in Lanchester and St John's Church, Burnhope.

She stressed that she will also ensure there is a regular supply of clergy to conduct services and provide the required amount of pastoral care at both churches, which have been left without permanent incumbents following the recent resignation of Rev Rupert Kalus and his curate, Rev Ali Miller.

### THE RIDE FOR JOAN

Neither of them had ever organised anything like this, but they felt strongly that Joan deserved a tribute and that funds raised would be for a good cause. To include all age groups, they decided on 3 distances - 5, 13 and 21

the railway paths for safety reasons. The ride (not a race) was based at the Malton Picnic area where BeeMyHome Estate Agents registered the riders and handed them their T-shirts. The 5 mile ride turned at Diggerland in Langley Park, the 13 mile at Broom Park and the longest at Esh Winning. At each turning point marshals and first-aiders were in attendance, to check and time the riders and provide extra water and sweets for energy.

34 cyclists set off on a sunny Sunday, the 5 milers in green T-shirts, blue for the 13 milers and the bravest riders wearing red. Mike Britton wore white as he was not sure how far he would be able to cycle. Only one of the participants was a regular cyclist, and many came from associated clubs from as far away as Catterick. One intrepid young man, 20 year old

Corey Wilson, rode a unicycle - no mean feat to maintain balance on the gravelly paths! Ages of riders ranged from Oliver White aged 7 who pedalled 5 miles, to Mike Britton himself 69 who finished the 21 miles, arriving back at Malton to a guard of honour and cheers and applause. In addition to the T-shirt, each cyclist got a certificate with time and distance.

After the ride everyone gathered round with tea and coffee, swapping stories and comparing sore behinds! Although the purpose of the ride was perhaps somewhat serious, there was much laughter and fun, everyone enjoying the day. There is already talk of 'next year'. At the time of writing funds are still coming in but the total to date is over £2,000. A wonderful tribute to a wonderful lady who will be sorely missed by the greater Taekwondo community.



#EduFootyAid is a new primary school teachers made possible thanks to charity football event raising money for Mind, the country's leading mental health charity. What makes #EduFootyAid extra special is that all the players are primary school teachers.

It was agreed that the Parish Council respond to the consultation and object to the removal of the lighting columns due to pedestrian and vehicle safety, antisocial behaviour factors, lack of footpath, effect on residents at Malton.

Green. The Councillorhad served on the Parish Council for many years and provided exceptional service to the Parish Council.

### Flooding Events and Flood **Alleviation Works**

Members were informed following the information received from the County Council.

The flood alleviation works include works to the culvert in Woodham Court which will require removal of trees. This work has commenced. Following this a large grated channel is to be

line opposite Woodham Court to intercept runoff coming down Newbiggen Lane. A grated channel is also to be installed across full width of Newbiggen Lane close to the entrance of Lee Hill Court to intercept runoff coming down Newbiggen Lane

With regard to the flood event on 2nd June, the County Council have confirmed that this was a 1 in 185 year event. Typically highway drainage and sewers are designed to a 1 in 30 year event. The scheme in Lanchester is designed to a 1 in 100 year event.

**Community Defibrillator** Members were informed that an appropriate community defibrillator had been identified. Lanchester Pharmacy had been approached and were happy for the defibrillator to be installed on their outside wall. It will be necessary to

provide electricity to the box. Planning permission will also be required for the defibrillator.

A resident has offered to fund the defibrillator. It was agreed that the Parish Council should part fund this project. It was agreed that the Parish Council would be delighted to receive a contribution towards the project.

The Annual Return was approved and accepted Financial report discussed and approved. Accounts for Payment approved.



### WWI Beacons of Light

### RECIPE OF THE MONTH

### **Chicken Bonne Femme**

There's such a lot of good things about one-pot cooking - the flavours of the ingredients mingle so well while cooking and nutrients are retained in cooking juices rather than being lost when vegetables are strained. Cooking in one pot is an economical, environmentally friendly way, and this is a new and delicious twist on roast chicken.

To serve 4 people, you need ...

1 chicken, weighing 1.8 kg/ 4lb

55 g/2 oz unsalted butter 675 g/1 lb 8 oz baby onions 675 g/1 lb 8 oz new potatoes

6 rindless bacon rashers. low diced

1 bouquet garni Salt and pepper Bay leaves, to garnish **METHOD** 

1) Preheat the oven to 180 degrees C/350 degrees F/ Gas Mark 4. Season the chicken well with salt and pepper. Melt the butter in a flameproof casserole. Add the chicken and cook over a medium heat, turning frequently, for 8-10 minutes or until browned all over. Transfer to a plate.

2) Add the onions, potatoes and bacon to the casserole and cook over a

stirring heat. occasionally, until the onions soften and the potatoes begin to colour. 3) Return the chicken to the casserole and add the bouquet garni. Cover and cook in the preheated oven for about 1 hour 30 minutes, or until the chicken is tender and the iuices run clear when a skewer is inserted into the thickest part of the meat. Remove and discard the bouquet garni.

4) Transfer the chicken to a large serving dish with the vegetables and bacon. Garnish with bay leaves and serve immediately.


