

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Beef and Red Wine Casserole The Healthy Way!

Autumn is rapidly approaching, and thoughts turn to comfort food, like rich casseroles. It's great when you find a recipe for a meal that's satisfying and warming and also a healthy choice. Serves 4, cooking time $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ hours, or 6-8 hours in a slow cooker.

Youneed:

800g lean stewing beef, with fat removed and cut into bite-sized pieces 4 garlic cloves, peeled and crushed

4 large carrots, peeled and cut into large chunks 3 leeks ,thickly sliced 4 celery sticks, cut into large pieces 800 ml beef stock 100 ml red wine 400 g can chopped tomatoes with herbs

1 bay leaf 2 tsp dried mixed herbs Salt and freshly ground black pepper

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 160 degrees C/Fan 140 degrees C/Gas3.

Place the beef in a heavybased casserole dish with the garlic, carrots, leeks and celery.

Stir in the stock, wine and tomatoes and add the bay leaf and mixed herbs. Season well and bring the mixture to the boil.

Cover tightly and place the casserole into the oven. Cook for 2-21/2 hours or until the beef is tender.


